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The Campbell Program

The Foreign Language Department features 20 distinct courses in Spanish and 16 in French. This diversity allows you, if you choose, to concentrate either on the literary/cultural aspect or oral/aural/written aspect of a language, though both areas are necessary for a well-rounded major.

Traditionally the goal of our majors is to teach language at the elementary or high school level, and there continues to be an extremely strong demand for language teachers.

Increasingly, though, our department is attracting students who combine language study with a second major. We strongly encourage such programs, because it makes our students even more competitive in the job market and provides more career flexibility. With this in mind, our courses are set up to facilitate a double major.

The Campbell Approach

We are a small department, which allows us to give you a great deal of personal attention. Major courses average five students, and there are numerous opportunities for independent study. In fact, most upper-level courses are offered on an independent study basis in which you typically meet one-to-three times a week with your teacher.

As a result, you will get to know your professors very well and you will undoubtedly profit from this both personally and academically in using your target language regularly.

The study of language is broad, so you will likely develop interests and strengths in many areas: literature, linguistics, culture, conversation, and writing. We will encourage you to spend time studying in a country where your target language is spoken, because you are sure to profit from this exposure to a language and culture different from your own.

The Campbell Faculty

Our full-time faculty members complement their strong academic credentials with extensive travel-professional experiences. Our backgrounds include a range of positions from teaching English in China, to publishing a work on Spanish literature, to work with the United States Foreign Service.

We are also fortunate to have the services of adjunct faculty members who also have both strong academic and practical experience.

Because of the department's size, each academic advisor has a small load, allowing us to concentrate on individual needs. The department also sponsors a Foreign Language Club, which will give you the chance to socialize and work on charitable projects with other majors.

The Campbell Student

Language study requires much work, dedication, and a willingness to practice your skills independently. There is considerable support available to those who need extra work. We have a state-of-the-art media center and free tutoring is offered through the department.

Travel experience and high school study have often been the points of departure from which our majors continue their study and interest in foreign languages. Our prerequisites are to have studied your target language in high school, or to complete our four semesters of basic courses here. Unless your background in high school is especially strong, you will likely take the 201–202 sequence at Campbell.

Our double majors are affiliated with many other departments, including Business, Communications, History/Government, Religion, and Family and Consumer Sciences.

Foreign Language: Bachelor of Arts

The fulfillment of the foreign language requirement at Campbell University depends on the degree which the student is seeking:

- Those students pursuing a Bachelor of Arts degree must complete their chosen language through the 202 level;
- Those students pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree must complete their chosen language through the 201 level.

The student may choose from the following languages: French, Greek, Latin, and Spanish. Students whose native language is not English are exempt from the foreign language requirements; however, they must complete both English 101 and 102 with a grade of "C" or better. Students in the Lundy-Fetterman School of Business must have two units of high school language or pass 101 and 102 of the same language at Campbell University.

Requirements for a Major in French

To achieve a major in French, the student must complete the following: French 201–202 Intermediate French, 221–222 Survey of French Literature, 231–232 French Composition and Conversation, 300 History and Civilization of France, 305 Phonetics and Pronunciation of French, and three additional French courses above the beginning level.

Requirements for a Major in Spanish

To achieve a major in Spanish, the student must complete the following: Spanish 201–202 Intermediate Spanish, 221–222 Survey of Spanish Literature, 231–232 Spanish Composition and Conversation, 241–242 Survey of Spanish-American Literature, 305 Spanish Phonetics and Pronunciation, and 341–342 Spanish/Latin-American Civilization.

Requirements for Teacher: Licensure in French or Spanish

The requirements for those majoring in French or Spanish and who seek to gain licensure to teach in secondary schools are the same as above but with the following additions: French or Spanish 400 (Methods and Materials of Romance Language Teaching) and the completion of the licensure requirements of the School of Education, as indicated on the curriculum outline.

Requirements for a Minor in a Foreign Language

A minor in French or Spanish requires eighteen hours beyond the elementary level. Prerequisites: All language courses above the 202 level assume that the student has completed through the 202 level or its equivalent.
