THE CAMPBELL PROGRAM

Pre-Pharmacy is an unique non-degree major specially designed to prepare you for entry into Campbell's highly regarded and competitive College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. This major is a two year program that will assist you in the completion of the requirements for entry into the School of Pharmacy.

The Doctor of Pharmacy program consists of four years of professional study after completion of at least two years of Pre-Pharmacy. After earning your doctorate degree, you are qualified to work in over 64 different areas of pharmacy.

A few of these areas include community pharmacy, emergency medicine, drug information, ambulatory care, cardiology, geriatrics, critical care, toxicology, and much more!

THE CAMPBELL FACULTY AND RESOURCES

Pre-Pharmacy Advisors make the educational needs of the student their top most priority. For example, we maintain an open door policy and welcome student interaction. We also spend considerable time on advisement. Each pre-pharmacy student will have an assigned advisor who is a faculty member in the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Your advisor will provide you with guidance, support, and help you plan your schedule each semester. In addition, there is a Pre-Pharmacy Coordinator, who works full-time to assist pre-pharmacy students.

THE CAMPBELL APPROACH

Pre-Pharmacy is one of Campbell's largest majors. Class sizes are small and you will also be exposed to state-of-the-art didactic, laboratory and computer instrumentation throughout your pre-professional training.

In setting your goals, you should know that our College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences is among the nation's most competitive. However our Campbell Pre-Pharmacy

students are so well prepared that they typically constitute more than half of each College of Pharmacy class.

PRE-PHARMACY CURRICULUM

The pre-pharmacy curriculum is intended for those students who have strong interest in the biomedical sciences. Our students are also dedicated, disciplined, and well-motivated. In addition to preparation for Pharmacy School, the curriculum also prepares students to enter the bachelor's degree programs in pharmaceutical sciences, clinical research, or other scientific disciplines.

The Pre-Pharmacy Club, sponsored by the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, introduces pre-pharmacy students to the numerous opportunities available to them. The club also provides interaction with practicing pharmacists and current pharmacy students through various campus activities and social events.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

- Admission to the four-year Doctor of Pharmacy program requires a minimum of two academic years of pre-pharmacy or pre-professional education (64-semester hours). Application for admission may be submitted after 32 semester hours of college credit.
- To be considered for admission, an applicant must submit an application, official post-secondary transcripts, and PCAT scores to the Pharmacy College Application Service (PharmCAS). Additional information regarding this process is available at www.PharmCAS.org.
- A supplemental application, \$25 application fee, and three letters of recommendation are also required to be submitted to the Admissions Office of the College of Pharmacy.
- Qualified applicants will be reviewed and an invitation for a personal interview may be extended upon completion of the application file.

PHARMACY SCHOLAR PROGRAM

The Campbell Pharmacy Scholar Program is designed to reward students who have demonstrated academic excellence during their high school education. Simply stated, it "**guarantees admission**" to the Campbell University College of Pharmacy for high school valedictorians, salutatorians and nominees from guidance counselors and principals who continue their legacy of academic proficiency when enrolled in the Pre-Pharmacy Program at Campbell University.

REQUIREMENTS FOR QUALIFICATION

The Campbell Pharmacy Scholar Program guarantees admission to the School of Pharmacy to students who meet the following criteria:

1. Graduation from an accredited high school in the United States as:
 - a. Valedictorian of graduation class
 - b. Salutatorian of graduation class
 - c. Have at least an unweighted 3.50 GPA on a 4.0 scale and be nominated by guidance counselor and principal.
 2. A High School transcript must be presented which verifies the applicant is qualified in one of the categories mentioned above.
 3. A Candidate must enroll as a Pre-Pharmacy student at Campbell University to complete the academic prerequisites to be admitted to the Doctor of Pharmacy Program.
(Transfer students may not participate.)
 4. The candidate must apply with the Pre-Pharmacy Office at Campbell University in the fall of their Freshman year to be considered for the program.
- Over the course of your undergraduate study:
5. College academic performance requirements:
 - a. Valedictorians must maintain at least a 3.5 Science/Math and overall GPA.
 - b. Salutatorians must maintain at least a 3.6 Science/Math and overall GPA.
 - c. Nominees must maintain at least a 3.6 Science/Math and overall GPA.
 6. The applicant must obtain a score of 75 or better in the Biology, Chemistry and overall composite portions of the Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT).
 7. The student's Pre-Pharmacy faculty advisor must endorse the candidate's application by submitting a letter to the Pharmacy Admissions Office.
 8. Candidates must successfully fulfill all requirements for admission to the College of Pharmacy, including the interview.
